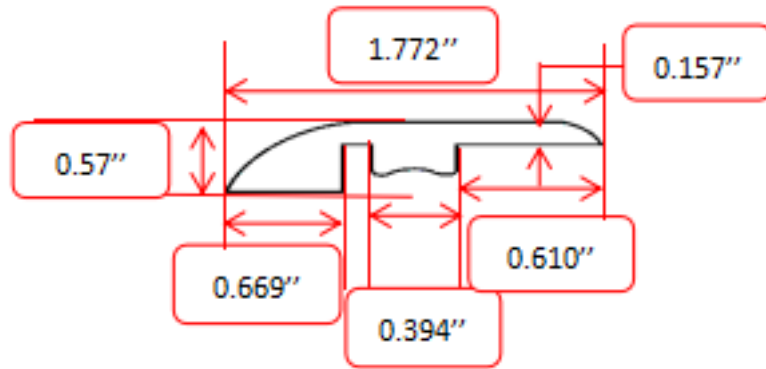

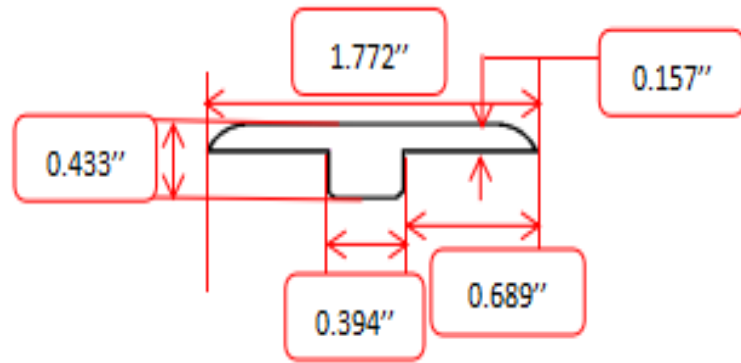
Reducer



Tips: The Reducer molding is the solution in locations where flooring of different heights meet together and a gentle slope is needed to bridge the two surfaces.



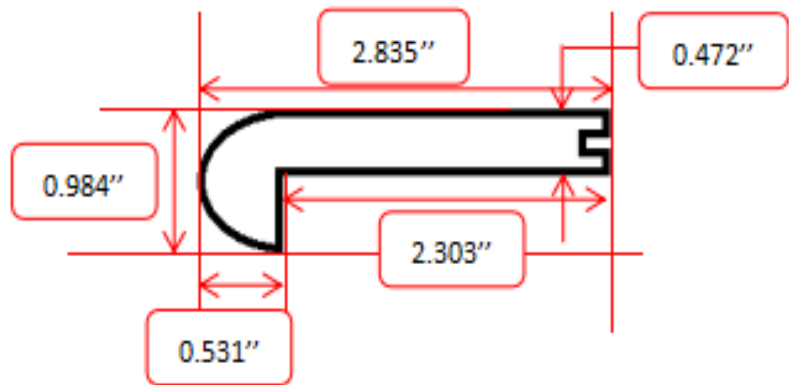
T-molding



Tips: This molding serves to cover the expansion gaps needed in a floating floor installation by bridging the space between two even surfaces. The low profile height and width bring a polished look to the job.

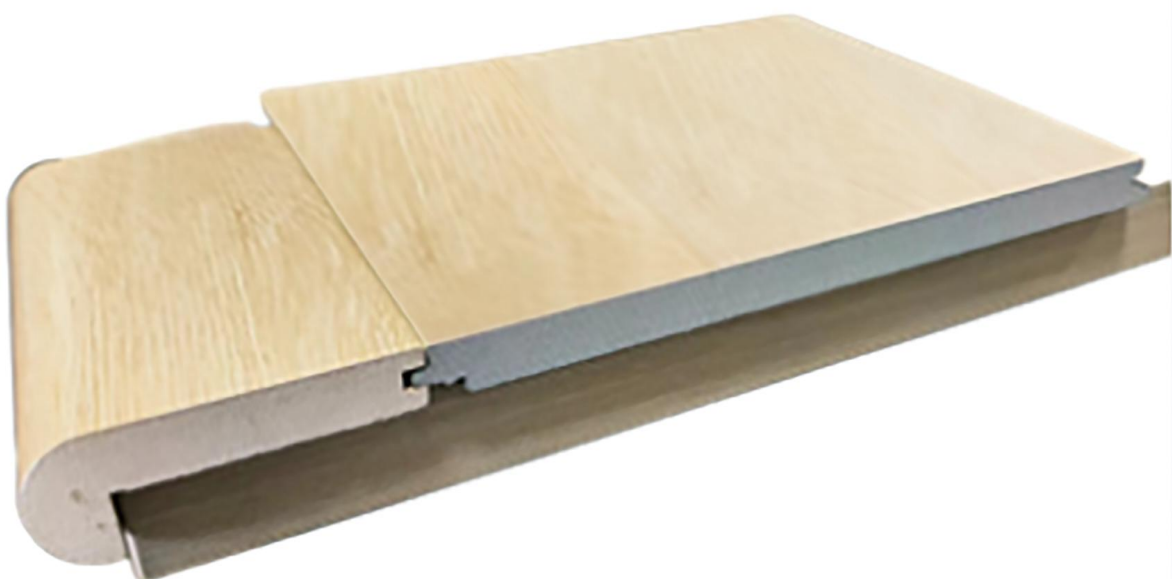


Stair Nose

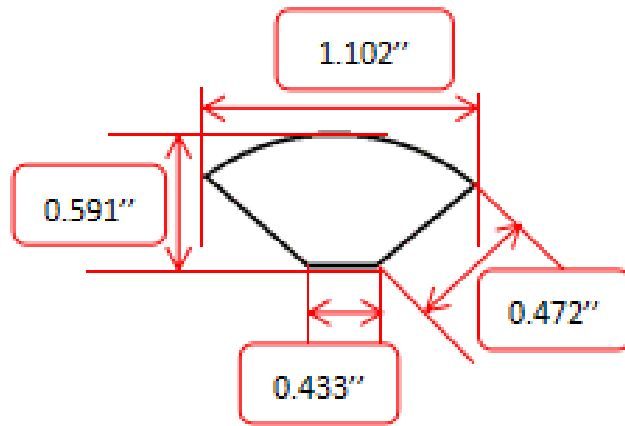


Tips: This Stair Nose molding may be installed flush mounted manner.

This versatile finished edge molding provides a solution for most staircase applications. The surface coating is made from reinforced Polyurethane so the stairs continue to be eye catching for years to come.



Quarter Round



Tips: Each piece of quarter round will end at either a joint, a corner, or a door jamb. Quarter round will always be cut at an angle, usually 45 degrees. Line up the longer piece of quarter round up against the wall where it will go. Spin your end cap so that the flat cut is up against the wall, the angle cut is against the other piece of quarter round, and the finished side is visible.
